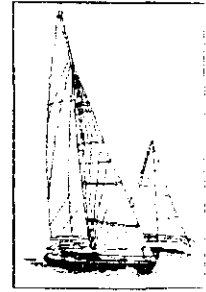

### \*CHILDREN

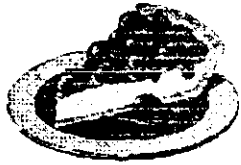
- 1) Please watch your children for their safety and concern for others.

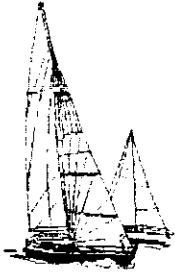

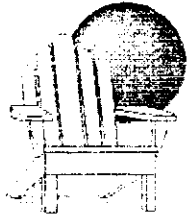
A name for our new boat is a must. We will take any and all suggestions. Write your suggestion on the sheet also posted on the bulletin board.

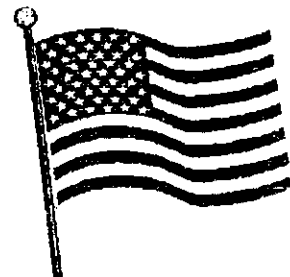
